

To request Direct Access availability, add the carrier code to the end of the availability with a change (x) before it. Schedule Display Many carriers participate in the GDS's Direct Connect Availability (aka Direct Connect)

program. Direct Connect instantly "links" availability to the GDS from the carrier's computer system.
The primary advantage of using a Schedule Display rather than availability is
To request a Schedule Display, use 'S' instead of '1' and add /ES to the end of the entry to get Extended Schedules (a longer range than just the requested date). Optionally, the carrier code can also be added to the request.
[Sabre] Example:
To request a Schedule Display, select (⊙) 'Extended Schedules' on the right side of the availability screen.
